

Syllabus for TELLIT: Math Affective Learning Environment

This course will help you learn how to address the affective needs of English Language Learners (ELL students). The affective learning environment is one that relates to or arises from feelings and emotions of students and teachers in an instructional setting, such as a classroom. During this course, you will view video segments of math teachers using effective strategies that will demonstrate culturally responsive learning and physical environments. You will have an opportunity to build a repertoire of instructional skills and resources as you examine key components of classroom communities that have a positive impact on students' cultural, social, and emotional needs. You may earn 2 CPE credits for this course.
